INTRODUCTION

Lights Out DC, an advocacy program modeled after *Lights Out Toronto* (Canada) and others in the US, was launched by City Wildlife, Washington, DC, in April 2010. “*Lights Out*” programs have been established in a growing number of major North American cities, beginning in the early 1990’s. They aim to quantify light-caused bird/building collisions and to encourage building managers to take steps that mitigate the damage to birds.

Twice yearly, during spring and fall bird migrations, millions of birds fly ancient routes to distant feeding and nesting grounds, often traveling thousands of miles. Most small birds migrate at night to avoid rough air patterns and to navigate by the stars. In cities, where lights are often on all night in tall buildings and pointed skyward, migrating birds become disoriented and fly into glass. Many are killed instantly. Others are injured or are so weak from trying to fly through the glass that they become exhausted and become victims of urban predators such as rats, crows, and gulls.

Results from counts like *Lights Out DC* provide invaluable information to concerned citizens and scientists about the problem of nocturnal bird/building collisions. The information in this report reflects the species and numbers of migratory birds killed and injured while passing through downtown DC to points north (in the spring) and south (in the fall). Comparisons of data in the coming years can be used to monitor changes in the distribution of these species and to measure the effects of (human) behavior change when buildings in the District adopt recommendations set forth by *Lights Out DC*.

Lights Out programs have been shown to reduce migrating bird mortality by as much as 80 percent in some cities. What’s more, they reduce light pollution and save participants money spent on energy costs. We see this as a win-win situation for people and migrating birds.

BIRDS FOUND

The following list includes all 30 species of birds found by *Lights Out DC* volunteers in 2010. The species are listed in standard ornithological order.

A total of 123 individual birds were picked up, and the number of birds of each species found is listed after the Latin name. For more detailed information, please see the attached data table.

METHOD

During the months of April, May, September, and October 2010, approximately twice a week, Mondays and Fridays, a group of *Lights Out DC* volunteers met at Union Station at 5:30 a.m. Generally they walked an hour-long route to the Convention Center and back, though sometimes a second route to the New York Avenue Metro station was included.

Routes were often extended by car for efficiency, and some of the volunteers covered extra routes on separate days or before the 5:30 a.m. meet-up time. Routes were intentionally arranged so as to include buildings with architectural features thought to be particularly problematic: tall glass atria, large expanses of reflective glass, overhead glass walkways, etc.

One volunteer did not join the group for the walks but monitored the court building where she works at 430 E Street, NW. Other individual birds were reported and delivered to the *Lights Out DC* group by people who were not regular volunteers. These birds are included in the inventory.

Dead birds were collected in plastic bags that were sealed shut. The date, location found, and species were written on the bag. The specimens were frozen. Injured birds were transported to Second Chance Wildlife Center in Gaithersburg, MD, for rehabilitation with the goal of release to the wild. A few birds recovered sufficiently that they could be released later that day by *Lights Out DC* volunteers.

A running inventory of birds was created, listing the species, location found, condition (dead, stunned, injured, or exhausted), disposition (freezer, released, died, or sent to rehab), weather conditions, and volunteer hours expended. At the end of the year, all bird carcasses will be delivered to the Smithsonian Migratory Bird Center for research or display.

Recommendations for collecting dead birds and handling adult injured birds were obtained from Toronto's FLAP (Fatal Light Awareness Program), *Lights Out Baltimore!*, and the New York City Audubon Society. Our work was permitted by the US Fish and Wildlife Service under a special purpose-salvage permit, number MB00680A-0.

CONCLUSION

1. The initial year of *Lights Out DC* data demonstrates that fatal and injurious bird/building collisions occur during the night in downtown Washington, DC, during times of bird migrations. Although height restriction of buildings in the District of Columbia may mitigate the number of nocturnal bird/building collisions in comparison with other cities, numerous collisions do occur.
2. Thirty species of birds were collected. All but five of these species are migratory birds, and the majority of them are neo-tropical migrants. Populations of many of these birds continue to decline each year for a number of reasons, including bird/building collisions in cities along their migratory routes.
3. Only a small portion of the District of Columbia's downtown area was covered by *Lights Out DC* volunteers. Moreover, volunteers did not monitor every day of the migration period. The resulting data is, then, but a sampling. Nonetheless, it indicates that bird/building collisions are a significant problem in the city and pose a considerable threat to the continued survival of some species of birds whose numbers are in serious decline.

Initial Lights Out DC Routes Spring, 2010

(Fall 2010 targeted consistently offending buildings rather than routes.)

NORTHEAST ROUTE

(1 hour)

- 1) Cross the front of Union Station to the Thurgood Marshall Building and check the area around the entrance.
- 2) Turn left and go one block north to the U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission at 110 F Street, NE. Turn right and walk to 2nd Street, NE.
- 3) Turn left on 2nd Street, NE, and walk along the west (left) side of the street looking for birds. Check the two inset parks at 600 2nd Street, NE, and proceed up to K Street. (There is not much to check between 700 2nd and K Street, NE.)
- 4) Take a left of K and walk under the railroad tracks.
- 5) Check the north and west sides of 111 K Street, NE, then cross 1st Street, NE.
- 6) Turn right and walk north on 1st Street, NE, checking around the buildings on the west side. Please go around the buildings where this is feasible. Some are under construction and may not always be accessible.
- 7) At N Street, NE, turn right and check 1275 1st Street, NE, and the new building in the 100 block of N Street, NE.
- 8) Turn left at the New York Avenue Metro station and check the Courtyard Marriott at 1325 2nd Street, NE. Also check the north side of the hotel on Florida Avenue, NE.
- 9) We are working at getting an arrangement to check the new Alcohol, Tobacco, and Firearms headquarters at N and 2nd Streets, NE, but this is not yet complete. The building has a wall of glass around a garden with trees on the O and New York Avenue side – just the sort of situation where one would expect bird strikes.
- 10) Retrace the route to Union Station.

NB – For a break, there is an Au Bon Pain next to the New York Avenue Metro that opens at 6 a.m.

NORTHWEST ROUTE

(1 hour, 15 minutes)

- 1) Take Massachusetts Avenue west in front of the Post Office Museum and then cross the avenue to F Street, NW.
- 2) Take a right on F Street, NW, and walk to New Jersey Avenue, NW.
- 3) Take a left, cross New Jersey Avenue, and walk around the National Association of Realtors building at 500 New Jersey Avenue, NW. Please walk all the way around this building as it is many stories of reflective glass that could prove dangerous to birds.
- 4) Walk back up to F Street, NW, and take a left into the Georgetown University Law School campus. Go past the clock tower and check the south side of the park, the Sports and Fitness Center, for birds. This may be difficult since there is long decorative grass growing at the base of the windows and the birds – if there – may not be evident.
- 5) Continue through the park and exit on 2nd Street, NW. Take a right on 2nd Street and walk north to Massachusetts Avenue, NW. There won't be much to check in this stretch.
- 6) Cross Massachusetts Avenue, NW, and look on the south, then west side of the Douglas Development Corporation building at 111 Massachusetts Avenue, NW.
- 7) Take a left on H Street, NW, and check 251 H Street, NW, Mayer Mitchell Building.
- 8) Pick up Massachusetts Avenue again at 3rd Street, NW, and go one block with nothing to check to 4th Street, NW.
- 9) Take a right on 4th Street and walk north to I Street, NW.
- 10) Take a left on I Street, NW, checking the north side of the street, where a glass building is under construction and may not always be accessible, and then the south side of the street for the other tall, glass building.
- 11) Pick up Massachusetts Avenue, NW, again at 5th Street, NW, and walk up to 7th Street, NW, checking both sides of the street, 635 and 650 Massachusetts, if possible (pairs can split up).
- 12) At Mt. Vernon Square, take a right on 7th Street, NW, and walk up to New York Avenue, the Convention Center.

- 13) The Convention Center is all glass and could produce a lot of strikes, but the south side has an overhang that may prevent finding birds. Instead of going along the south side, proceed up 7th Street, NW, checking the east side of the Center.
- 14) Take a left on L Street, NW, and walk west two blocks through a glass canyon to 9th Street, NW.
- 15) Turn left on 9th Street, NW, and check the west side of the Center down to New York Avenue, NW.
- 16) Cross New York and 9th and take a right on K Street, NW, to check 901 K Street on the north side then the Embassy Suites (LEED certified) at 1050 K Street, NW, on the south side.
- 17) Turn left at 11th Street, NW, and go down to New York Avenue, NW.
- 18) Take a right on New York Avenue, NW, and do a quick check of the front of 1101 New York, where we have found birds before.
- 19) Turn around and retrace your steps, checking 1099 New York Avenue, NW, where more birds have been found.
- NB – For a break, the Starbucks at 10th and New York opens at 6 a.m.
- 20) At 9th Street, NW, cross New York Avenue and turn left.
- 21) Walk along the south side of Mt. Vernon Square, checking the pedestrian mall with the elevated glass passageway at 800 K Street, NW.
- 22) Proceed to Massachusetts Avenue, NW, and retrace your steps to Union Station.
